About the Campaign in Tarrant County, TX



GBG launched as a Back-to-School campaign in Spring 2024

- Outreach inclusive of digital ads, video views, social media impressions, website visitors, earned media, and billboards across the Ft. Worth metro area.
- Total reach/impressions at 52M
- It is safe to say that every parent in Tarrant County saw Go Beyond Grades messaging at least once and many saw the messaging numerous times.



Sustaining GBG in Tarrant County

- Campaign continues under the leadership of Fort Worth Education Partnership in partnership with Learning Heroes
 - 2024 Spring / Summer campaign
 - 2024 Back-to-School
 - 2025 Spring / Summer campaign

Evaluation

- Fielded in April / May 2025
- SKDK conducted a custom, online survey among parents of students in public schools in Tarrant County.


Key Findings

- The sustained, year-long, multi-channel campaign led to a decline in the proportion of parents who believe their child is at or above grade level in both reading (-12 points) and math (-8 points).
- In reading, we saw the biggest shifts among parents who rated their child above grade level - before the campaign, 58% of parents believed their child was **above** grade level. One year later, there is a 13% drop to 45%.
- In math, we saw the biggest shift with parents who rated their child at grade level before the campaign, 49% of parents believed their child was at grade level. One year later, there is a 5% drop to 44%.
- The campaign got the attention of school district leaders. Fort Worth ISD referenced the campaign in a video launching a district-wide campaign to address the district's low literacy levels.

3.8M families reached* and 441K engaged** through digital media (includes digital ads, video views, social media impressions, and website visitors)


2.2M earned media impressions and **46M** OOH (billboard) impressions


Parents Who Believe Their Child is At/Above Grade Level




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Parents are confident they understand how well their child is achieving academically – though Hispanic parents, lower-income, and non-college parents are more likely to only be somewhat confident.







Most parents report their children getting A's and B's, though non-college-educated and middle-income household parents are more likely to report mostly B's and C's.
